Donovan J. Rogers, 65, of River St. Chateaugay, died Sunday, May 30, 2021 at his home. Born on March 28, 1956 in Malone, NY, he was the son of Warren and N. Colleen (Quinlin) Rogers. They predeceased him.

He had many lifetime friends that he enjoyed spending time with.

“ Uncle Donovan Rogers was a pillar of our family. My whole life he gave me positive encouragement with the energy of a super friend and super fan. He got me into music and exposed me to a world of passionate music that included the great artists of rock & roll history. Through his influence, I gained appreciation for powerful lyrics and equally powerful music. I always enjoyed it when I got to play drums for him, whether it was one of about 8 times he came out west and saw me perform as part of his trips to visit our family or when I could set up the drums for him and rock in the living room. I wish I could have done that more for him. He talked several times about having a music festival at the farm, and we always entertained ourselves with how cool that would have been. He became the sole proprietor of the farm at the young age of approximately 27, when his mentor and prize-winning farmer, and another pillar of kindness, Stewart Swanston, passed along the business to him. We were lucky to have Donovan, a guy with a huge personality full of love, energy and enthusiasm to match. He made the trip to WYO back in 1987 for my high school graduation, with my grandmother Colleen. He stayed at our house and my parents, Kathy & Wayne loved having Donovan and Grandma Colleen visiting. That weekend I was excited to have Uncle Donovan in town to see my band and also to see the State Track Meet....He cheered loudly-above the crowd for our team, and I remember hearing his yells of encouragement as I rounded the last turn of 800 meters in the 3200 meter relay. He made me excited to play music. He understood music, especially the power of rock music more than most people, maybe even more than everybody. In the 1990s Donovan drove all the way across the country both to see our family and to see me perform with my band. It was one of the highlights of my life to have him at shows in Arizona. We (including my sister, Kathleen and Kenny Cook) also went to the amusement park in Phoenix that had a big rollercoaster, and of course we went on it... We got disoriented as it was super steep. He came out west a few more times too...So many great times to remember. Uncle Donovan came out to Colorado in 2007 & 2008 for Kari & Lee's wedding and for Mike & Stephanie's wedding. He had great fun, and again brought amazing energy to the parties. He rode with me when we drove over the Rocky Mountains cranking tunes and enjoying life. I remember telling him that on the infamous Trail Ridge Road, we drove above 12,000 feet in the air to get over the mountains....The air was thin. I pointed out to him that above treeline that the air gets thin...He flashed concern, and I said not to worry, because we would be heading back down the mountain soon. He gave me more encouragement to ay music than anybody else. He was (as he said: my biggest fan). The truth is I was always his biggest FAN. UNCLE DONOVAN: I am going to miss you dearly for the rest of my life. Thank you for your laughter, happiness, smiles, love of music, appreciation of my drumming and support of my music, and for being such an amazing person in our family. I am happy and proud that you were loved by so many people in CHATEAUGAY and the surrounding communities. Fly on....FLY ON. OH, and our times in Montreal together....PRICELESS. I had the coolest uncle in the world.
