We first met back in 1977 on Parris Island SC, he was one of my Drill Instructors when I enlisted in the Marines. We reunited again back in 2013 when I was finally able to track him down. I remember the phone call like it was yesterday, I think I completely caught him off guard. I asked him if he had ever been in the Marines because I wasn’t sure if I had the right person, he said yes and then I asked if had been a Drill Instructor to which he said ‘yep’. I told him my name and that I was one of his recruits back in 77. He had two questions: ‘How the hell did you find me and what the hell do you want?’ I said I looked you up on google and found a number and I was calling to say Thank You. He got really quiet and I thought maybe he hung up, but then he said something that I will always remember, he said “ In my entire time in the Marines I never heard from any one of my recruits and I just want you to know that this phone call has made my whole week”. We talked for a long time that day and if you knew Ed, you know he wasn’t much for phone conversations, but we had years of catching up to do. We met up in 2015, I had him and Pete down to Boston for a Red Sox game and then we remained in contact weekly from then on.
