

Mr. Harold Phillips

Harold Phillips, 87, of Constable, New York, passed away peacefully on November 9, 2025, at Alice Hyde Medical Center.

He was born in St. Regis Falls on December 16, 1937, to the late Eleanor (LaGray) and James Lloyd Phillips.

Harold was a lifelong resident of the North Country and a proud, active member of his community. He dedicated over 50 years to the Constable Fire Department, served as a town councilman for 20 years, and later as Constable Town Supervisor for 10 years. His strong work ethic and commitment to service left a lasting mark on everyone who knew him.

Harold began his working life on Langdon's Farm, later worked on the construction of the St. Lawrence Seaway, and went on to enjoy a 40-year career with General Motors, starting in 1959.

On July 5, 1958, he married the love of his life, Anne (Flynn) Phillips, with whom he shared many wonderful years before her passing on August 26, 2012. Together they built a loving family and a lifetime of memories.

Harold is survived by his two sons, Brian (Rosie) Phillips of Texas and Bruce (LaMoine) Phillips of Texas; three daughters, Sheila (Mick) Maguire of Potsdam, Marla Kulaszewski of Las Vegas, and Stacey Otis of Malone; and one sister, Arlene Bishop of St. Regis Falls. He is also survived by 16 grandchildren, 16 great-grandchildren, one great-great-grandchild, and many nieces and nephews, all of whom adored him dearly.

In his younger years, Harold loved fishing, hunting, camping, bowling, skiing,

and woodworking. He was an incredibly skilled craftsman who built his own home and designed much of its interior himself — including the cabinetry and fine details that made it so special. He took great pride in the home he built, a place that stood as a true reflection of his hard work, skill, and devotion to his family. Harold was also an avid fan of baseball and football, enjoyed traveling with his wife to visit their grandchildren, and could often be found working on a puzzle or word search.

Harold will be remembered for his unwavering dedication, his quiet strength, and his deep love for his family and community.

Calling hours will be held at St. Francis of Assisi Church, Constable on Friday, November 14 from 9 to 10:30 a.m. A Mass of Christian Burial will immediately follow at 10:30 a.m.

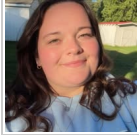
