



Mr. Howard E. Glazier

October 19, 1938 - December 30, 2019

Howard E. Glazier, 81, a life-long resident of Mt. View, NY, passed away December 30, 2019 in Yakima, Washington. He was there to celebrate the holidays with his son, Michael.

Howard was born at the Alice Hyde Hospital in Malone on October 19, 1938, the son of Everest (Zeb) and Leola Glazier. He graduated from Franklin Academy in 1956. He then went on to attend St. Michael's College in Burlington, VT. He left college in 1958 to join the US Navy. Howard completed his basic training at Great Lake Naval Base and transferred to sea duty aboard the USS Toledo (CA-133).

Howard made four tours to the Pacific Theatre and spent time in Japan, Hong Kong, Hawaii, Manila, Philippines and Vietnam. He arrived home to Malone Christmas of 1961. He then started work at the family owned business of Glazier Packing Co. Inc. where he remained employed until retirement in 2015.

He was married to Josephine Towey, August 14, 1976 at St. Joseph's Church in Owls Head, NY.

He was predeceased by his parents; sisters, MaryLee Glazier and Carol Ann Yankanick, and his ex-wife, Josephine.

He is survived by three brothers and a sister-in-law, John and Twila of Malone and Florida, Ronald of Phoenix, AZ, and Giles of Malone; one sister, Louise Taylor of Malone, and one brother-in-law, Nicholas Yankanick.

A graveside service will be held on Saturday, October 10 at 11 a.m. at St.

Joseph's Cemetery, Lake Titus Road, Malone. Military honors will be provided by the Malone Veterans Firing Squad.
