



## Mr. James William Vaughn

May 5, 1942 - October 27, 2021

James William Vaughn passed away on Wednesday, October 27, 2021 after a 15-year battle with Parkinson's Disease, due to exposure to the defoliant, Agent Orange, while serving in Vietnam. Jim fought the disease gallantly to the end, never letting it define him. In the last months of his life he was diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML).

Jim was born in Burke, New York, on May 5, 1942, the son of Kenneth and Eunice (Sweet) Vaughn. He graduated from Chateaugay Central School, New York, and served as Class President in the great class of 1960.

In 1964, Jim enlisted in the US Army and after Army ASA School, he served a year in Germany. In 1965, he traveled to Sitges, Spain (on the Costa del Sol). While there, he met his future wife, Pattie, who was there on vacation from Northern Ireland.

In April 1966, he graduated from US Army Infantry OCS and was promoted to 2nd Lieutenant and after further training in Ft. Hollabird, Maryland and Ft. Bragg, North Carolina, he deployed to Vietnam in October 1966. He served two tours of duty (1966-68) and returned to the US 21-months later as a Captain, at which time he was honorably discharged from service.

Jim married Marina Patricia (Pattie) Watson of Belfast, Northern Ireland, on August 3, 1968, in Pattie's family parish, St. Paul's (Anglican) Church of Ireland. Over the years, he enjoyed many visits to Pattie's homeland, and embraced her family as his own, and they him. After the couple became engaged, his maternal Grandmother Sweet remarked that he had gone "home" to find a bride. She went on to explain that her mother was born in the same County as Pattie and had emigrated with her family from Ireland in 1862. This contributed to Jim's lifelong interest and extensive research in genealogy.

Jim was a loving husband, father, grandfather, colleague, and friend. As a father, he was proud of his son's work ethic and character. He especially cherished the time spent with his grandchildren, Emery and James. He took great pleasure in following their accomplishments in school and sports. He never missed an opportunity to attend one of their soccer games. As Jim's illness progressed, the children visited often showing great love and compassion for their Papa, as they listened to his stories, poured over photo albums, played card games, shared laughter, and wheeled him around the neighborhood in his "chariot." Throughout his life Jim exuded joy and an abundance of good will and he

never met a stranger. His family and friends will remember him for his loyalty and integrity, his gift for telling a good joke, his indomitable spirit, and his enduring love for his hometown – Chateaugay, New York.

After graduating from SUNY at Potsdam, NY, Jim entered on duty as a Special Agent for the FBI. His assignments included Louisville, Kentucky; Detroit, Michigan; Washington, DC; and Wilmington, North Carolina. Jim retired from the FBI in November 1998, and was proud to have served his country for a combined total of 33 years.

After his retirement from the FBI in 1998, Jim founded his company, James Vaugh Investigations, and conducted investigations throughout the United States. He contracted with and conducted background investigations for the FBI, Department of Justice, Homeland Security, and the Department of State. He also contracted with the Wilmington Housing Authority, NC, as a security advisor.

He is survived by his devoted wife of 53 years, Pattie; his son, Ian, and daughter-in-law, Kelly; two grandchildren: granddaughter Emery, and grandson James, all of Wilmington, North Carolina; his brother, Lynn (Cheryl) of Ogdensburg, New York; his brother-in-law James Watson (Mena) of Ballymena, Northern Ireland; and sister-in-law Jacqueline McClelland (Donald) of Belfast, Northern Ireland, and a special "sister" cousin Elaine (Hunter) O'Connor of Chateaugay, New York. He is also survived by several nieces and nephews.

Jim was an active member and former Senior Warden of Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, Hampstead. Jim did not fear death because he knew that a good and loving God awaited his soul. This is a gift of God to each and every one of us.

A memorial service was held at Holy Trinity Episcopal Church, Wilmington, NC, on Nov. 19, 2021. Jim's remains will be buried at a graveside service at the North Burke Cemetery on August 10, 2022, at 1 p.m., where he will be the 5th generation of Vaughs to be interred. The Rev. Thomas Higman will officiate.
