



Mr. John J. (Jack) McCarthy

February 10, 1925 - June 28, 2017

John J. (Jack) McCarthy, 92, of Malone, NY died Wednesday, June 28, 2017 at the Alice Center in Malone.

Born in Brandon, NY on February 10, 1925, he was the son of John and Mary (Sullivan) McCarthy.

He married Anne Huntington in 1946 at St. Joseph's Church. He graduated from Brushton High School in 1943. Jack served in the U.S. Army 83rd Calvary Reconnaissance Troop from 1943 to 1946. He served in Europe and participated in the Battle of Bulge and was honorably discharged in 1946. In his early years, he was employed by Interstate Loan and Maine Midland Bank. He later became self-employed in the insurance industry with Security Mutual Life Insurance Co. and retired in 1989.

He enjoyed all kinds of sports, especially golf and basketball. He coached a little league baseball team for ten years, bowled at the Elks and hunted every fall. He raised three tomato plants each summer courtesy of Tom St. Mary and loved sitting on his front porch. He was affectionately known as the "Mayor of Second Street".

Jack was an ardent golfer, a life member of the Malone Golf Club. He belonged to the Malone Lodge of the Elks, was a 70 year member of the American Legion Post 219, and a member of the early morning coffee club (where problems of the world were solved).

He loved going to Lake Placid for the bobsled races and looked forward to being the official time keeper for the harness races at the fair each year.

He is survived by his wife of 70 years and his three children, Anne (Halsey) Betters, John (Nell) McCarthy, Daniel (Tina) McCarthy; five grandchildren, John Betters, Katherine Johnson, Nicholas McCarthy, Jillian Riley and Wesley Tennyson and nine great-grandchildren; a sister, Grace Edna Freer; a brother-in-law, John T. Huntington as well as several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his parents, a sister, Helen McCarthy and two brothers, Robert and William McCarthy.
