



Mr. Norman "Stubby" LaMare

December 29, 1936 - May 29, 2019

Norman "Stubby" LaMare, born December 29, 1936, in Lyon Mountain, N.Y., passed away at CPVH on Wednesday, May 29th, 2019, at the age of 82, surrounded by his loving family. Stubby fought a long battle with Non-Hodgkin's lymphoma and bladder cancer that he acquired during his years as a Marine at Camp LeJeune in North Carolina.

Stubby was a member of St Bernard's Church, Lyon Mountain, NY; Lyon Mountain Volunteer Fire Department, Past President; Lyon Mountain American Legion Post 1623, Past Commander; Hunter's Home, Past President; and was President of the AFL-CIO United Papers Workers Union for 14 years. He retired from Georgia-Pacific after 30 years of service as a certified mechanic. He also served as a foreman on Gore Mountain during the construction of the ski lift, worked in at Crucible Steel in Syracuse, in Massachusetts drilling through tunnels for the interstate system, and he was the last miner to clock out of the Republic Steel iron ore mines in Lyon Mountain before it officially closed. Stubby proudly served in the Marine Corp at Camp LeJeune in North Carolina.

Stubby loved his time in Fort Pierce, Florida where he lived with his sweetheart, Jeanne, every winter for over 30 years. He loved to fish on his pontoon boat, hunt and golf. He looked forward to Friday night card games with the family, especially the past few years as moving on his own became more and more difficult. He loved swimming, telling jokes and stories (like the one about Wilbur), and he loved going to garage-sales and flea markets and getting a great deal. Serving his community was important, and many will

remember years of Stubby as volunteer auctioneer to raise money for the Lyon Mountain Fire Department and Legion. Stubby had a life time of memories and stories and anyone who knew "Norman Anthony Texas Bernard LaMare Jr. the Second" has at least one great story to tell. It's these memories that will help us remember a man who was larger than life, a life he loved and fought hard for until the very end.

Calling hours will be held on Monday, June 3, 2019, from 12 PM to 2 PM at St. Bernard's Church in Lyon Mountain, NY. A Mass of Christian Burial will immediately follow at 2 PM. Pallbearers will be grandsons, Nick Chase, Alex Chase, Christopher Cross, Mark Chapman, James Supley, and Lance Forkey. Honorary Pallbearers will be granddaughters, Amanda Chase, Sarah Chase, Kayla Supley-Forkey. Burial will be held in St. Bernard's Cemetery, Lyon Mountain. A luncheon for family and friends will be held following the burial at the American Legion Post 1623.
