Richard D. Kramer, 70, of the Spear Hill Rd., Merrill died Friday, Dec. 30, 2011 at the Albany Stratton VA Medical Center.

Born in Brooklyn, NY on July 2, 1941, he was the son of Philip and Virginia Caroselli Kramer. His parents predeceased him.

Mr. Kramer attended St. Edmund's School and Northern Adirondack Central School. He enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1963 and was honorably discharged in 1966.
