Roland M. Dominic, 87, of Churubusco, passed away Sunday, November 2, 2025 at the Alice Center, Malone.

Born on September 1, 1938 in Ellenburg, NY he was the son of Edward and Emma M. (Bushey) Dominic.

He was married to Shirley A. Kelly on September 20, 1958 in Ellenburg by Rev. Earl Taylor.

He worked for Agway for 27.5 years while farming before moving on to Northern Adirondack Schools as a custodian for 11 years. In 2006 he began helping his son and daughter-in-law at Dominics Hardware. After a devastating fire in January 2009, they rebuilt the store in its current location, opening its doors in September 2009. He was a communicant of St. Patrick's Church, Chateaugay. He enjoyed fishing with his father-in-law in earlier years and hunting in later years.

Roland is survived by his wife of 67 years, Shirley; his children and their spouses, Roland "RJ" Dominic of Mooers, Anthony Dominic of Westville, Christine and Glen Bray of Fort Covington, John and Lynne Dominic of Brainardsville, Shawn and Kim Dominic of Constable, James and Lynn Dominic of Churubusco; twelve grandchildren; twelve great grandchildren; one great great grandson; and a great great granddaughter on the way; siblings, Mayfred Chaffee, Ragel (Maureen), Nancy Wayne, Marylee (Roy) Fonner, Larry (Valerie), Robert and Jane (Anthony) Angello; a sister-in-law, Donna Dominic; as well as several nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his parents; a daughter-in-law, Brenda Dominic; four brothers, Maynard, Gary, Billy and Reginald Dominic; a sister, Antoinette Toohill; and in-laws, Bill Toohill, Doug Chaffee and Joan Dominic.
